Sustainability and Spanish Immersive Experience

The 360° Sustainability Experience Immersive Residency is a 14 day, bilingual program for all ages and audiences. It was specifically created for learning or volunteering groups that wish to have an experience abroad and are excited about Sustainability and Costa Rica.

By the end of this program participants will:

- Be immersed in a Sensory Experience
- Reflect about their own personal relationship to nature
- Become an ambassador of sustainability

This project will work with different key concepts related to sustainability as promoted by the UWC Costa Rica. We will generate actions inspired by the Sustainability Principles (SPs):



Building Blocks Methodology

There are 5 building blocks that work as the main components of the program's content.

Daily Rhythms: Help us integrate our overarching philosophical framework into the everyday rhythm of the residency over time.

Discussion Themes: Are the core themes we want to learn about, knowledge that helps us frame activities and conversations.

Immersive Experiences: Are the activities that put the action into an experiential cycle of the different themes.

Reflections: No learning is complete without internalization and contemplation of the information, experiences and action.

Community Compilations: Is the recording, in various formats and styles, of our experiences in order to share it



Activities are structured around 3 main areas/components:



Community engagement through sustainability experiences

Throughout our stay in San Isidro, all of our activities and food suppliers are centered around local agents within the San Isidro community with whom we are interested in fostering long-term relationships of mutual benefit. We will be learning about local initiatives linked to sustainability, conservation and regenerative production.

Biodiversity and Conservation

We will be identifying different ecosystems and species that live next door to the campus in San Isidro. We will learn about conservation, wildlife protection and environmental management. This component **includes a visit to the Toucan Rescue Ranch, a visit to the Braulio Carrillo National Park, and walks in the forest trail in the San Isidro campus.**

Life cycles: Organic production, biofertilizers and composting

Using microorganisms taken from the forest, we will create organic fertilizers (non chemical) which will be applied to the orchard where we will be planting vegetables and learning about organic farming. This component includes a planting activity in the orchard in alliance with the Ministry of Agriculture, a visit to the Composting Plant in San Isidro and a visit to a local farm, (member of the CAZ), called Pinar del Río to learn about their farming practices and products


Learning outcomes

- Learn about local ecology in the San Isidro campus Understand processes of reciprocity, care and interconnection.
- Foment stewardship role we have (from the UWC Costa Rica) to the nature we cohabit in and with our neighboring communities.
- Apply ethics of care and responsibility.
- Connection with nature and bio-sensitivity through being in nature - foment sense of being part of a community of life.
- Develop a sense of community through familiarizing with neighbors, spaces, businesses and projects in San Isidro, as well as with our "inner community" sharing a space during this week.
- Learn about life cycles of organic planting, consumption and decomposition Generate Action Plan with projects and activities related to sustainability in the Santa Ana campus and/or with the San Isidro community.
